COVID 19 UPDATE: THE INDEPENDENT INSTITUTE OF EDUCATION



The President's directive for drastic action to flatten the spread of the virus has been heeded and we are attending to this call and continuing with our educational programme, as our ongoing commitment to you and your future.



Our campuses will be closing for contact teaching from Wednesday 18 March; thus Tuesday 17 March will be the last day of face-to-face teaching. All activities, social and cultural and sport events are also cancelled. We will be continuing with our academic programme using Learn – lecturers will post or broadcast mini-lectures on core concepts and post additional resources and direction on the Learn space for each of your modules. Assessments can be submitted on Learn. Learn classes have been opened for the small number of IIE modules currently not taught on Learn.



We will be using strict social distancing for tests which we will, after consideration, continue to conduct for now. We will be staggering start and end times to ensure that there is limited interaction between students coming to campus to complete their tests. We will also have far fewer students in each room than we would normally have. Please follow the instructions of campus teams to manage this.

Our facilities remain accessible to you if you require them, although your access will be limited by our efforts to ensure that no single venue or facility is unable to implement the required distancing. Your patience will be needed but we are sure you understand the decisions being taken.

Please contact your campus if you have specific questions about arrangements. You can also use the itsusupport@iie.ac.za helpdesk if you are experiencing access problems for Learn. You also have access to the Student Hub as always.

As circumstances change, we will communicate any further amendments to our programme – we hope to resume contact classes on 14 April.

Post School Education and Training – Minister Nzimande’s Press Briefing



The Independent Institute of Education has aligned with the position communicated by the Minister.



We will therefore not begin teaching online tomorrow (18 March 2020) as originally communicated and will instead resume our academic programme no later than the 15th of April 2020.



Leading up to this, we will communicate the details of our arrangements, amendments to the academic programme and its assessment and any other details as they unfold. Please monitor your campus mail addresses and other normal campus communication channels regularly. Students are encouraged to use the time productively by continuing to work through the platforms and learning material you already have.



Like the public Universities our campuses will remain open. Students needing to access the campus will, like our staff, comply with the health and safety and prevention requirements of social distancing and hygiene such as hand washing.

Students already being taught online, as they are registered in the distance mode, are not impacted by this communication at this stage.
